GENERAL ORDER ADOPTING THE COLLATERAL FORFEITURE SCHEDULE FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS IN THE EASTERN DISTRICT OF TEXAS

Attached to this General Order is a copy of Title 38 Code of Federal Regulations § 1.218 which defines certain terms, sets out a list of offenses which are prohibited, and assigns a penalty for each. The penalties assigned to each of said offenses, as defined, are hereby ADOPTED as the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule for the Department of Veterans Affairs, in the Eastern District of Texas. Offenses for which collateral may be posted in lieu of appearance and the amount of said collateral shall be the offenses set out in the Code of Federal Regulations and the value of the collateral to be posted that is subject to forfeiture shall be the amount of the penalty assigned to each offense.

Under Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 58(d)(1) collateral may be posted in lieu of personal appearance of a person charged with certain petty offenses under the laws or regulations of the United States. Upon the failure of the person charged with a petty offense violation to appear before the United States Magistrate Judge for trial of the offense, collateral in the appropriate amount, as shown on the attached Schedule, shall be forfeited to the United States and serve as the fine for said offense. The posting of collateral shall signify that the person does not contest the charge or request a hearing. Collateral forfeiture shall constitute an admission of guilt. This general order supersedes General Order 09-11.
