GENERAL ORDER PROVIDING FORFEITURE  
OF COLLATERAL IN LIEU OF APPEARANCE

As authorized by Rule 8, Rules of Procedure for the Trial of Misdemeanors before United States Magistrates,

IT IS ORDERED that for the petty offenses (as that term is defined by 18 U.S.C. Sec. 1(3) ) listed below in the attached schedules, whether originating under applicable federal statutes or regulations, or applicable state statutes pursuant to the operation of 18 U.S.C. Sec. 13 ("The Assimilative Crimes Act"), occurring within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States Magistrates for the Eastern District of Texas, violators may post collateral in lieu of appearance in the amount indicated for the offense, waive appearance before a United States Magistrate, and consent to the forfeiture of said collateral. Persons charged with offenses listed as "mandatory appearance violations" must personally appear for trial for disposition of the charge or for other proceedings, as provided in 18 U.S.C. Sec. 3401.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon the failure of the person charged with an offense listed in the attachments to appear before the United States Magistrate for trial, except for those offenses denominated "mandatory appearance violations", the posted collateral, in the amount listed opposite the offense, shall be forfeited to the United States. The posting of collateral and failure to appear for trial shall signify that the violator does not contest the charge or request a hearing before the United States Magistrate. If the collateral is forfeited, such action shall be deemed a plea of guilty as to the offense charged. Nothing contained in this order shall prohibit any law enforcement officer from arresting any person for the commission of any offense, including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited, and requiring the person charged to appear before a United States Magistrate or, upon arrest, taking him immediately before a United States Magistrate.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court for the Western District of Texas, or the United States Magistrate, shall certify the record of any forfeiture of collateral for a traffic violation to the proper state authority.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court for the Western District of Texas shall maintain a record of violation notices transmitted by enforcement agencies, a record of all payments made pursuant to this Order, and shall notify the

proper enforcement agency of those violations which are not disposed of as provided in this Order. Further the Clerk shall maintain such other appropriate records as may be necessary to effect the prompt disposition of petty offenses.

The failure of this schedule or of any violation notice or other charging instrument to include a statutory citation, or the inclusion of any erroneous statutory citation, shall not affect the jurisdiction of the Court to proceed on such charge. The penalty fixed by any rule or regulation promulgated by a federal agency shall not be applicable to an offense for which a different penalty has been provided in a specific statute enacted by Congress. In such event the range of penalties fixed by Congress shall be applicable.

From time to time amendment of one or more of the schedules of offenses may be necessary or advisable. The Court may amend such offense schedule without amendment of this Order in its entirety by Court approval of a new schedule or schedules as the need may occur and recur. Any amendment of a schedule shall affect only that schedule. This Order and remaining schedules otherwise shall remain in full force and effect.

The administrative and fiscal operations of the Central Violations Bureau of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Texas were consolidated with the Central Violations Bureau of the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas on October 1, 1981. Such operations of the Central Violations Bureau for this District shall continue to be maintained and conducted by the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, pursuant to the laws of

the United States of America.

The institution and prosecution of federal criminal proceedings including violation notices is within the jurisdiction of the Department of Justice, and must be specifically authorized by the Attorney General or the United States Attorney. In prosecution or other proceedings in such cases before a District Judge or Magistrate, the Government shall be represented by an attorney authorized by law to represent the United States.

A petty offense may proceed on a violation notice or as otherwise provided in Rule 3(a), Federal Rules for the Trial of Misdemeanors before United States Magistrates. Prosecution by violation notice is limited to petty offenses. The United States Attorney is requested to proceed on Misdemeanors, other than petty offenses by indictment, information or complaint filed with the Clerk of the Eastern District of Texas. Misdemeanors other than petty offenses shall be referred by the Clerk to the appropriate Magistrate or District Judge for further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that prior General Orders of the court providing for the Forfeiture of Collateral in Lieu of Lieu of Appearance for the Eastern District of Texas, are expressly revoked and rescinded, and are hereby superseded by the provisions of this Order and attachments made a part hereof.

The offenses for which collateral may be posted and forfeited in lieu of appearance by the person charged, together with the amounts of collateral to be posted are identified

in the exhibits referred to below, copies of which are available in the office of the United States District Clerk:

1. Exhibit A - offenses occurring on United States military installations.
2. Exhibit B - offenses occurring on property under the charge and control of the National Park Service.
3. Exhibit C - offenses occurring on property under the charge and control of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, or involving fish and wildlife under the jurisdiction of the Fish and Wildlife Service.
4. Schedule D - offenses occurring on property under the charge and control of the Veterans Administration.
5. Schedule E - offenses occurring on property under the charge and control of the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army.
6. Schedule F - offenses occurring on property under the charge and control of the General Services Administration or of the Postal Service.
7. Schedule G - offenses occurring on property under the charge and control of the Forest Service.
8. Schedule H - offenses occurring on property under the charge and control of the Bureau of Land Management.

This order is being entered by the undersigned as Chief Judge, with the unanimous consent of all the Judges of this Court.


