GENERAL ORDER

The office of part-time Magistrate Judge, Sherman Division, is presently vacant, and

The Judicial Council of the Fifth Judicial Circuit has recently recognized the continuing need for Magistrate Judge resources at Sherman, Texas. The Magistrate Judges Division of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts has authorized the continuation of this position for a term of four years, at the current salary level of \$4,787.00 per annum, and has authorized the Court to take appropriate steps to appoint a part-time Magistrate Judge to fill this position; and

The Judges of this Court desiring to appoint a part-time Magistrate Judge, accordingly, it is

ORDERED that the following named persons shall be and are hereby appointed to a Merit Selection Panel prescribed by Chapter 5 of the "Regulations of the Judicial Conference of the United States Establishing Standards and Procedures for the Appointment of United States Magistrates," viz.:

U. S. District Judge Paul N. Brown, Sherman, Texas

Mr. Rayburn Nall, Sherman, Texas

Mr. Joseph W. Wolfe, Sherman, Texas

It is further

ORDERED that the Panel shall perform such duties as the Court may assign, including, but not being limited to, those duties set

forth in Section 303 of the Regulations above mentioned and shall on or before the 28th day of February, 1992, report to the Court specifying the persons the Panel has determined as best qualified, attaching to said report all written information received by or prepared by the Panel concerning the recommended nominees. It is further

ORDERED that Judge Paul N. Brown, shall be, and he is hereby, appointed Chairman of the Panel.
