ORDER REGARDING JUDICIAL REVIEW OF CIVIL IN REM FORFEITURE CASES

While judicial review and authorization of civil <u>in rem</u> forfeiture cases filed by the United States are not required by statute (<u>see</u> Rule C(3), Supplemental Rules for Certain Admiralty and Maritime Claims), such cases are routinely submitted for judicial review and authorization in this district. These cases frequently necessitate expedited judicial review. They also require a probable cause determination of the type regularly made by United States magistrate judges. Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED that civil <u>in rem</u> forfeiture cases filed by the United States in this district shall be reviewed and authorized by United States magistrate judges.
